

What are Parent Packs?

Parent Packs are an important means of communication between the school and families. Each student has a colored folder that comes home on Friday (or the last school day of the week) and must be returned on Monday (or the first school day of the week).

In your Parent Pack you will find PTA and school memos (including scrip order forms), unless you who have chosen to receive information via ePTA. If you are on the ePTA list, you will receive informational fliers by email rather than on paper. Some teachers also use Parent Packs to send home classroom work.

You may use the Parent Pack to return any necessary forms (lunch funds, field trip money, official forms) to school and to send in your scrip order each Monday. To avoid duplication, only the youngest child in each family receives all school memos. If you lose a Parent Pack, please send a note to your child's teacher and PTA will replace the folder.

How does all the information get into my child's Parent Pack?

A wonderful PTA volunteer for each class fills the Parent Packs every Friday morning. You can make their jobs easier by cleaning out and returning your child's Parent Pack each week.

What do I need to do with my child's Parent Pack?

- Check your child's Parent Pack each time it comes home (usually on Friday);
- Complete any necessary paperwork/ payments and put them back in the Parent Pack;
- Send the Parent Pack back to school with your child (usually on Monday);
- Remind your child to TURN IN the Parent Pack to his/her teacher first thing in the morning!
